Project Description:

Large scale mansion refurbishment in South West London. This was a complex project which combined the restoration of the existing building with new build works which needed to respect the buildings heritage and surroundings.

JTC's Services:

JTC worked with the stone contractor on the staircase in the main entrance hall to develop an appropriate design incorporating treads, risers, landings with a complex geometric balustrading and handrail. JTC also produced the working drawings and oversaw the installation of the staircase to completion. JTC designed and built a second Oak staircase from the first to second floor to compliment the main staircase and advised on bespoke ironmongery to suit the door furniture.

In addition to the main building works we also undertook the delicate repair and modifications of a 1727 antique break front mahogany bookcase. The modifications included designing and installing concealed LED lights to display a collection of rare artefacts owned by the client.
